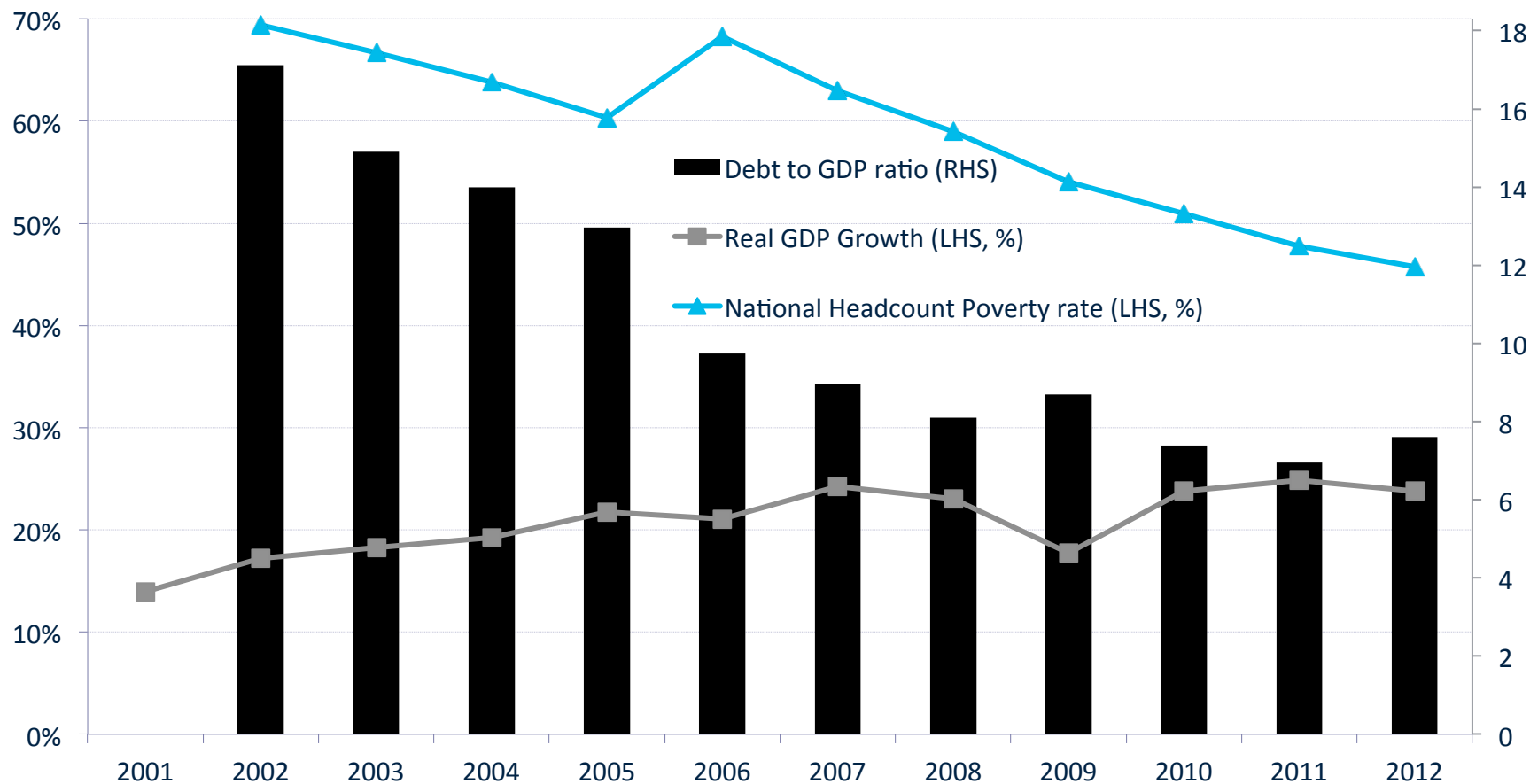

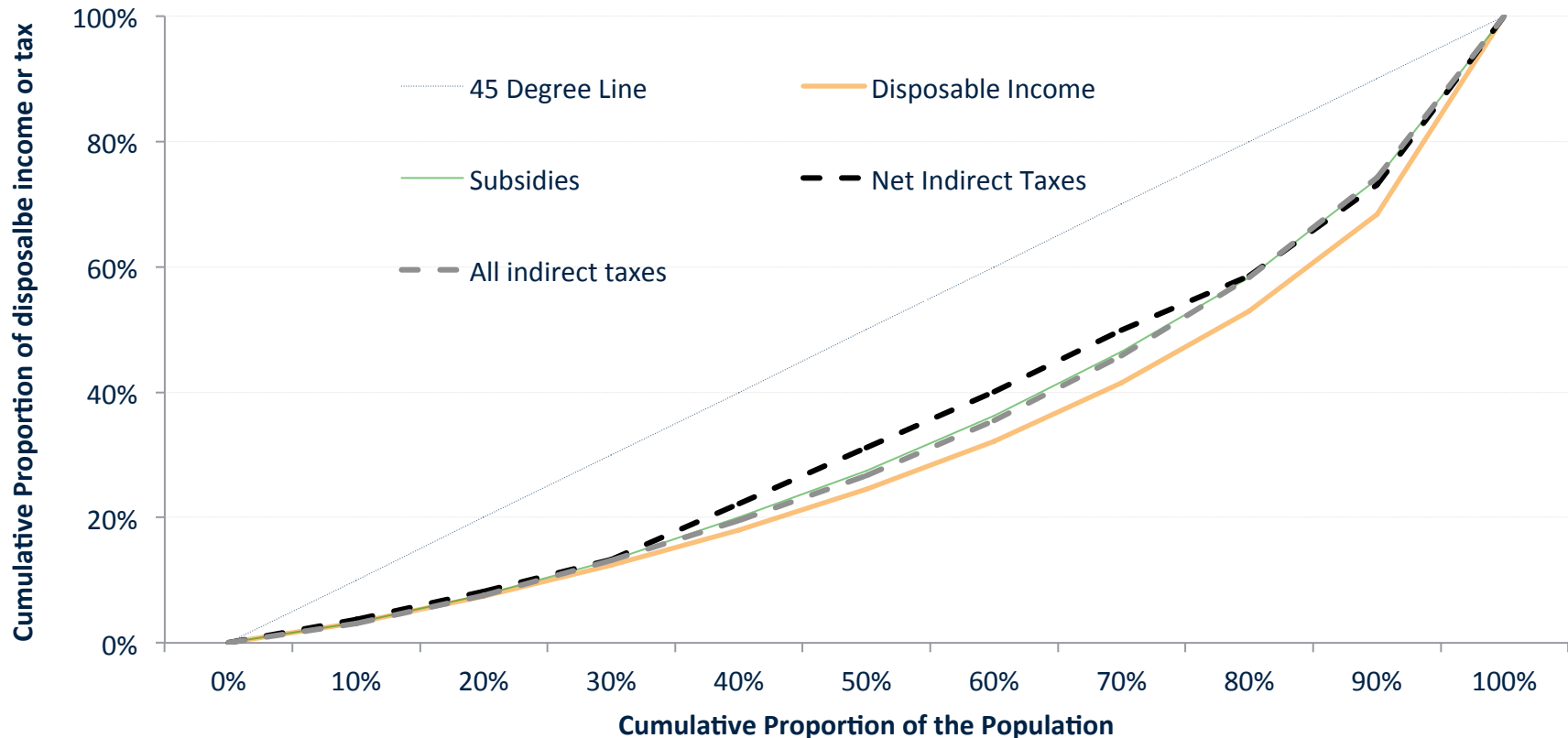

Energy subsidies go primarily to the rich, but *net* post-consumption incomes are more equally distributed....

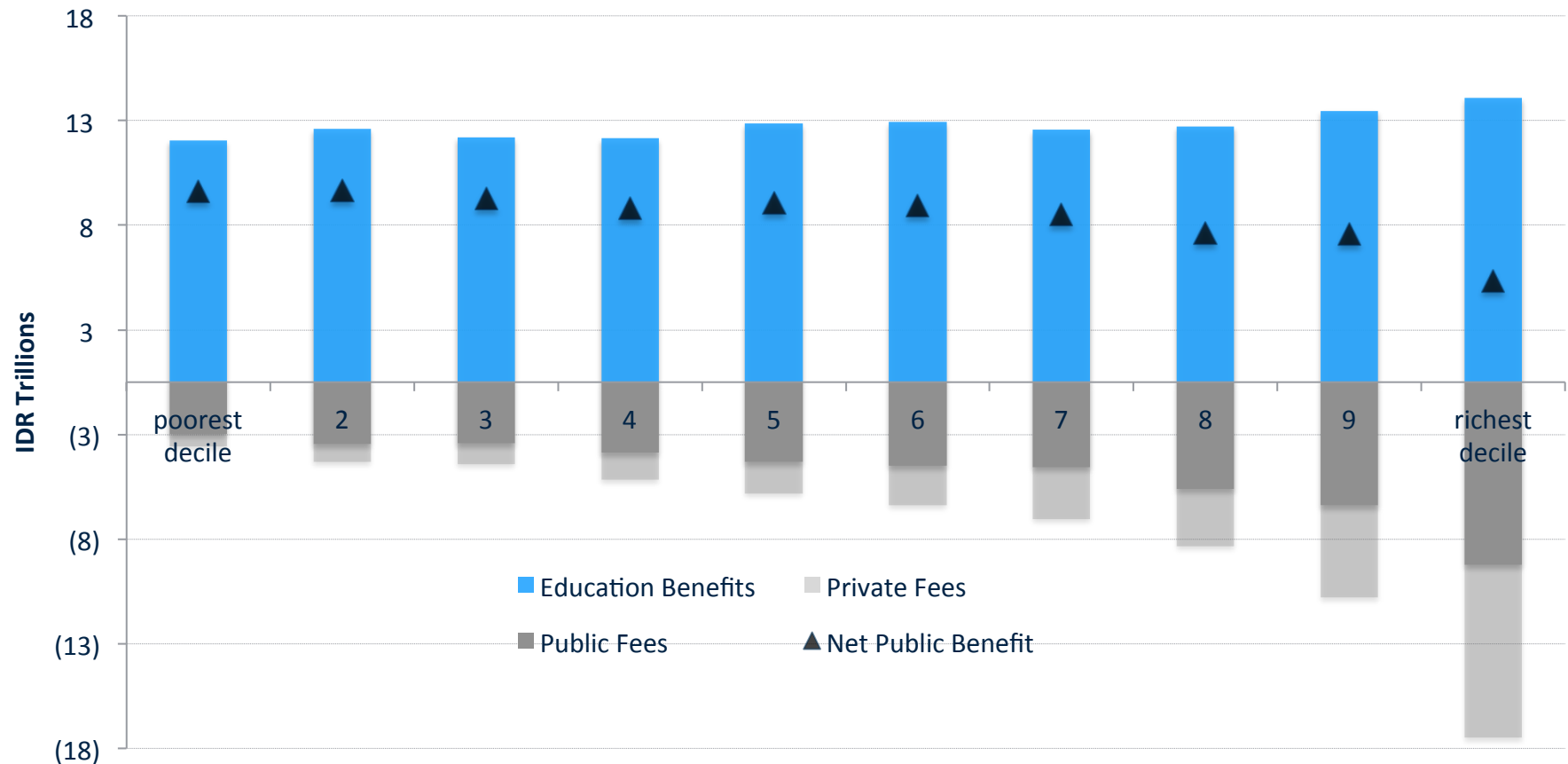
Concentration Shares, indirect taxes and subsidies

Education Benefits and Fees (by income decile)

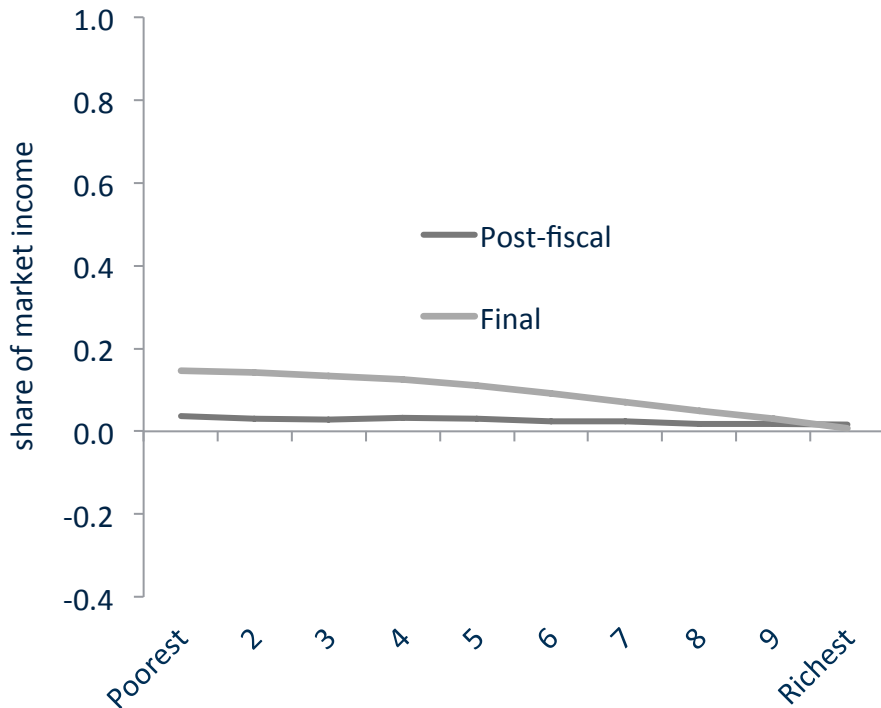


Expected and Unexpected Findings

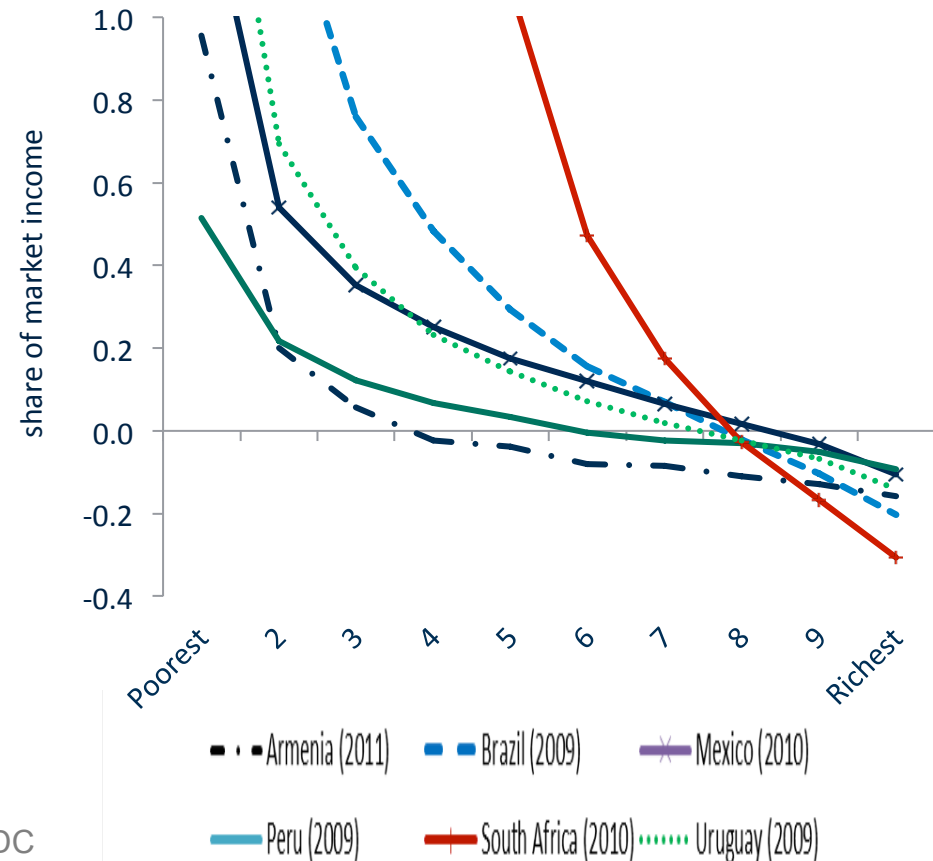
Neutral distribution of significant benefits; burdens leaves most households better off...
